





The Sell Family Rolling Hills Percherons

In 1910, William Wesley Sell bought a 94 acre farm in Walkerrown NC In 1949, W. W. "Bill" Sell inherited 47 acres of this farm from his father's estate. Since that time, three more generations of "Percheron producing Sells" have been born on this same farm; Robert, his daughter, Robin, and son, Alvin, then came the grandchildren Jeremy and John, Until 1967, Bill ran a dairy and raised tobacco along with other crops including corn. grain, and hay. At the present time, along with the 47 acres, the Sells lease an additional 20 acres for farming, The main crops raised now are corn, oats, and alfalfa hay. They plant their corn, sow grain, cultivate corn, rake hay, and do some plowing with the Percherons. They have havrides, and at times, lease their Percherons to the city of Winston-Salem for several events that involve horses. At the present time, the family has twelve head of registered Percherons and have had as many as 19 at one time. They also keep a small herd of Hereford cartle on the farm.

The Sell Family is believed to have originated in England or Germany. The name Sell is associated with English and means, "dweller in the shelter for animals" or "in the headman's hut".

In 1938, Bill Sell bought his first Perchetons, a pair of grade, grey marse called Queen and Part. He bought one mare from Frank Hilton, Walnut Gove, NC and the other from his brother Ellner. These two mares worked very well, and this sparked a real interest in Percheron horses. Bill raised colts and worked Queen and Par until they were 21 wears of the properties.

In 1972, the Sells bought their first registered Perchenos from Obed M, Yoder, Millersburg, Ohio, These grey mates, COMMANDERS QUEEN "KATIE" 251223 and COMMANDERS (AUDY 251400 were full sisters, sired by FURN'S COMMANDER 250165, 19978 Can. Alvin, at twelve years of age, won the hirch class (in a class of eleven) with these mates at the 1974 Disic Classic Fair. In 1977, Rolling Hills Percherous sold their first coles, a stud and filly, from them at the Eastern States Sale in Columbus, Ohio, they crecived \$3000,000 for these two coles.

Two more fillies were bought in 1974; A BON'S TOPSY 23206; Tom Harry Blair, Concool, NC and LA BELL'S TRICLA From H. E. Warner, Old Washington, Ohio. LA BELL'S TRICLA 252134; and CAS-SANDRA "K won first place in the Mare and Foal class at the 1983 Dixic Classic Briz. LA BON'S TOPSY and her daughter, PATSY DEGAS placed 2nd in the 2-up hitch in 1981 Dixic Classic Briz. LA BELL'S TRICA has raised a foal every year, this year will be her evident.

In 1980, the Sell Family bought their

At the Topeka Sale, in March of 1984, the Sells met John Pulver from Roanoke, Indiana. They bought four mares from Mr. Pulver: 10 DON FARM'S OSTRALIEN TOPSY 251396 and her three daughters. TOPSY'S LORENA 254188, TOPSY LINDA 255342 and TOPSY'S DAWN 257366, these mares were all sired by LEONET'S JASON 251901. With these mares, the Sells have had a successful '84 show season. TOPSY'S LORENA was 1st place aged Percheron Mare and Grand Champion Percheron Mare at the Dixie Classic Fair. She went on to the NC State Fair and won 1st place in the cart class. "DAWN" was 1st place 2 year old Percheron Mare at the Dixie Classic Fair. These three mares also won the Get of Sire for the Sells, and LORENA and LINDA won the Produce of Dam. At the Ohio State Fair. LORENA and LINDA stood in 6th place in the Produce of Dam class. The Sells have really grown to love these mares, and are thankful to John Pulver for affording them such an opportunity.

The Sell Family has registered 22 foals, and they consider ROLLING #ILIS PATSY DEGAS 253958 to be the best they have ever owned. PATSY was fouled April 7, 1978, she was sired by PAT LA REX 2346461, and our of LA BON'S TOPSY 234067, she now stands 17-1 and weighs over a ton. PATSY has been Grand Champion many times. 
